A fee of one dollar will be charged students who fail to take an examination as scheduled.

Subject may be dropped only with the approval of the Administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. A student may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade, but if he drops a course the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

Students will be permitted to repeat subjects totaling not to exceed sixteen quarter hours on the two or four year course.
