The Organizations Committee of the Student Council wishes to call to the attention of the college, as a whole, the following organization policies and standards. All changes, effective immediately, are underlined.

- 1. Organization of New Clubs A group must have 15 members in order to organize and to be approved by the Student Council. This group must consult with the Chairman of the Organizations Committee and present a constitution. The constitution must be approved by the committee, whereupon the committee presents the request for such an organization to the Student Council. If the Council approves the place and value of the new organization in the extra-curricular activities, officers and advisers may be elected; and the organization is entitled to representation on the Student Council. An Organization must hold at least 9 meetings a year in order to be considered an active organization.
- 2. Disbanding of Organizations Any college organization wishing to disband must notify the Chairman of the Organizations Committee of the Student Council. This Committee presents the matter to the Student Council who vote upon the request.
- 3. Organization Advisers All advisers are requested to be present at organization meetings. It is their responsibility to see that the building is opened in time for meetins and that the building is locked and all lights turned off at the close of the evening. All programs for club meetings or social events must be planned with the counsel of the adviser. Club officers are asked to confer with the college administration if a new faculty adviser must be selected. If

college administration if a new faculty adviser must be selected. If any college adviser wishes to resign office of adviser, the college administration must be notified. The faculty advisers have the authority to deduct activity points if officers or members have not fulfilled their duties.

4. Standards of Officers and Committee Chairmen. Scholastic average of C or above. The number of offices a student may hold during any one quarter is limited to two offices of a dissimilar nature; i.e., no person may hold two presidencies or two treasurerships, etc., at the same time. Class officers must be elected by April 15. Organization officers must be elected by May 1.

5. Standards of Members of Organizations. A person must be present at two-thirds of the regular meetings of the organization, unless excused by the adviser or president of the organization.
