P.O. Box Assignments: The Post Office box assignments are posted in the Post Office. Please check your box number and call for your mail at least once a day.

Textbooks: The Textbook Library will be open every day during the second and sixth hours.

Deans' Notices: A student who finds it necessary to leave school before the close of the quarter should make arrangements with the Dean of Women or Dean of Men for an honorable dismissal. If it is impossible to do this before leaving, the student should write to the Deans as soon as possible explaining fully reasons for leaving.

Registrar's Notices: Students are requested to leave their addresses and telephone numbers at the telephone in the business office if they were not located when they registered.

Students who expect to graduate at the close of the spring quarter must make application for their diplomas in the Business Office not later than Friday, March 24th.

Courses not completed at their conclusion for reasons approved by the administration will be recorded as "Incomplete." Such "Incompletes" must be removed the next quarter of attendance. If not completed within the year the Incomplete is recorded as a failure. Students who received an incomplete in any subject must make arrangements for make-up work with the instructor before the close of the third week of the following quarter.

Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course.

A student program is a sixteen-hour program, exclusive of physical education or a one-hour course unless additional courses have been approved by the administration. No credit can be allowed for work which does not appear on the program card. This program card must be on file in the Office of the Registrar.
