Course in Nursery School Education Students planning to take Education 258 - Nursery School Education during the spring quarter please see Miss Verrell at the nursery school before the beginning of the quarter. This course acquaints the student with the aims and methods of nursery school education as preliminary to teaching in the kindergarten and primary grades and affords the student the opportunity for observation and participation in the nursery school and for discussion of problems of guidance during the early years of childhood. The course is an elective with a credit of four quarter hours and may be applied on a kindergarten certificate.
