Courses not completed at their conclusion for reasons approved by the administration will be recorded as "Incomplete". Such "Incompletes" must be removed by the next quarter of attendance. If not completed within the year, the "Incomplete" is recorded as a failure. Students who received an incomplete in any subject must make arrangements for make-up work with the instructor before school closes for the holidays.

Students on the secondary degree course must complete the constants and one major other than education, and two minors or two majors. The constants are listed on page 32 in the catalog. Major and minor requirements may be found on pages 33 and 40 inclusive. The constants for students majoring in elementary education are the same as in the secondary field except as indicated. In addition, they must earn credits in each field as listed on page 33. Students should consult the heads of the departments in which they plan to major and minor.

Before students will be assigned student teaching, they must have a C average in all the prerequisite subjects. Students who do not earn the required honor points will be required to repeat subjects in which they lack honor points. Students will be permitted to repeat only four subjects on either the two-year or the four-year curriculum.
