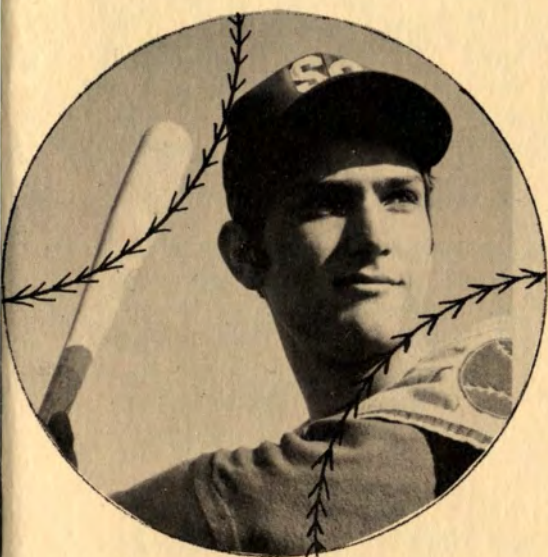

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Located along the Mississippi River in St. Cloud, a central Minnesota community of 40,000, St. Cloud State College was established in 1869 as the third state normal school. The first building was the old Stearns House, a hotel which was purchased by the State Legislature for \$3,000 and remodeled for use as a school.

In 1898, the school began offering a full junior college curriculum, and in 1921 it was authorized by the Legislature to adopt the name of St. Cloud State Teachers College. In 1925, St. Cloud was authorized to grant a four-year Bachelor of Education degree. The degree was changed to Bachelor of Science in 1940. The 1953 Legislature authorized the college to grant the graduate degree, Master of Science in Education, and in 1957 the school's name became St. Cloud State College.

Although the college has remained primarily a teacher preparation institution, authorization was given in 1946 to grant a Bachelor of Arts degree. A two-year Associate in Arts degree in general or professional education was authorized in 1948. The 1963 Legislature authorized St. Cloud to award M.A. degrees.

St. Cloud State College is a member of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education and the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

In the 100 years since its modest beginning, the college has grown steadily and now has a multi-million dollar physical plant, nearly 500 faculty members and about 10,000 students. To accommodate this ever-increasing student body, the college is engaged in a long-range building program.

Recently completed facilities include Atwood Memorial Center and a performing arts center. Halenbeck Hall, St. Cloud's health, physical education and recreation building with its 7,500 seat gymnasium, was opened in 1965. Dedicated during the centennial year were a Performing Arts Center, three residence halls for students, and a new school of business building. Now under construction is a spacious learning resources center.

THE OUTLOOK

St. Cloud State College captured a share of its second straight Northern Intercollegiate Conference baseball championship last spring and set a new single season team record with 22 victories.

In fact Coach Jim Stanek, in three seasons with the Huskies, has piloted his club to an enviable won-loss record of 63-18.

Continuing that torrid pace in 1971 seems unlikely following the departure of nine lettermen off last year's club.

Gone are such All-NIC performers as Mike Trewick at second base, Steve Strandemo at shortstop, Bob Carruth in the outfield and Dennis Lorsung behind the plate. Also gone are Bob LaCroix, Mike Graham, Jerry Henkemeyer, Steve Prueter, and Dick Ollila. All will be hard to replace.

Stanek will attempt to fill the gap at catcher by bringing Bob Britz in from left field. Transfer Bob Kelly should pick up the slack at shortstop. Second base and two outfield posts, however, remain up for grabs.

Pitching should be a bright spot, especially with four seasoned lettermen returning. Stanek remains cautious, however, following injuries to two key performers. They are Dan Jensen, Greg Thayer, Steve Fuchs and Jim Tomczik.

THE HUSKIES' COACHING STAFF



HEAD COACH JIM STANEK

Jim Stanek will hold the baseball reins at St. Cloud State College for the fourthtime in 1971.

A product of North High School in Minneapolis, Stanek took over for Dr. John Kasper three years ago and now boasts an impressive 63-18 record.

Stanek got his real start in baseball as a first baseman under Coach Kasper in the early 1950's. Following his graduation, Stanek coached at Winthrop High School for two years before entering the University of Minnesota where he held the post of assistant track coach while doing graduate work.

Twelve years of service at Coronado, Calif., High School as head baseball coach, assistant football coach, athletic director and administrator of boys physical education followed before he returned to his alma mater in 1967.

Besides serving as head baseball coach at St. Cloud, Stanek also holds the post of defensive line coach with the Huskies during football season.

Married with one son and one daughter, Stanek has his B.S. degree from St. Cloud and his M. Ed. degree from the University of Minnesota.

Dennis Smith will take over as Jim Stanek's number one assistant on the baseball front this spring.

A year ago Smith returned to the St. Cloud State College campus to continue his graduate studies, and last season he served as the Huskies' junior varsity boss in basketball.

He became a full-time member of the St. Cloud coaching staff last fall and served as freshman basketball coach during the 1970-71 season.

Smith is a former Husky who got his athletic start in football, basketball and baseball at Morton High School. At St. Cloud, he starred in baseball for three years under Coach John Kasper.

During his undergraduate days at St. Cloud, Smith also served as freshman coach in baseball, trainer in basketball and assistant freshman cage coach.

Smith was graduated in 1967 and immediately took over as the head basketball coach at New London-Spicer High School.

Married with one son, Smith has his B.S. degree from St. Cloud and now is completing his M.S. degree.

Returning Lettermen

Bob Britz. . .6-2. . .190-pound sophomore from Memorial High School in Pierz. . . bats left and throws right. . .saw action in 21 games as a freshman. . .used primarily in the outfield last year but currently ranks as the Huskies' number one catcher. . .has good power. . .owns a strong arm. . .hit .263 in his rookie campaign with one homerun and two doubles.

Steve Fuchs. . .6-2. . .175-pound senior from Technical High School in St. Cloud. . . bats right and throws right. . .one of four lettermen pitchers returning for 1971 season. . .had a 5-2 record last year with a 2.22 ERA. . .struck out 39 as a junior. . .throws very hard. . .was 4-0 in the NIC with a 1.32 ERA. . .also hits with power. . .runs very well.

Bob Hokkanen. . .6-0. . .160-pound senior from Annandale. . .bats left and throws right. . .saw limited duty last season as a utility outfielder. . .will be bidding for a starting role in his final campaign . . .runs well. . .owns an accurate arm and gets a good jump on the ball. . .regarded as a sound bunter. . .must hit with consistency to break into St. Cloud's lineup.

Dan Jensen. . .6-0. . .180-pound senior from South Haven by way of Annandale High School. . .bats right and throws right . . .will be mainstay of St. Cloud's mound staff. . .very fast. . .hardest thrower of all St. Cloud pitchers. . . Named to All-NIC team last spring after finishing season with 6-2 record . . .had a 2.21 ERA and led team with 74 strikeouts. . .wants to play pro ball.

Charlie Munsch. . .5-11. . .170-pound senior from Wood Lake. . .bats right and throws right. . .will hold down third base while serving as team captain in his final campaign. . .also won three letters in basketball as a guard for the Huskies . . .led St. Cloud with .389 average last spring. . .set team record with 25 RBI's . . .hits with power. . .named to All-NIC team as a junior. . .wants to play pro ball.

Returning Lettermen

Duane Peterson. . .6-1. . .170-pound junior from Cokato. . .bats right and throws right. . .hit .333 last spring as St. Cloud's utility infielder. . .ranks as the leading candidate for the Huskies' second base job in 1971. . .is very quick . . .has accurate arm. . .hits to all fields. . .is most dangerous with men on base. . .is a 'veteran of Minnesota's summer amateur baseball program.

Mike Schneider. . .6-0. . .170-pound junior from St. Joseph by way of Cathedral High School in St. Cloud. . .bats right and throws right. . .took over as the Huskies' center fielder last spring. . . may be fleetest of all Huskies. . .arm regarded as dependable. . .hit only .221 as a sophomore but eight of his 21 safeties went for extra bases. . .notched 10 stolen bases last spring.

Greg Thayer. . .5-11. . .175-pound junior from Technical High School in St. Cloud . . .bats right and throws right. . .was one of the Huskies' starting hurlers last spring. . .throws hard but plagued by wildness in 1970. . .finished with 4-1 record and fanned 46 in 36 2/3 innings. . .was St. Cloud's number one quarterback last fall. . .had surgery on left shoulder in November.

Jim Tomczik. . .5-11. . .160-pound junior from Cathedral High School in St. Cloud . . .bats right and throws right. . .was a part-time starter and number one reliever on Huskies' mound staff in 1970. . . finished with 3.82 ERA and 5-1 record in his first campaign with SC varsity. . . struck out 44 in 30 2/3 innings of mound duty. . .has fine curve ball. . .needs only to gain consistency.

Mark Weiss. . .6-2. . .210-pound senior from St. Bernard's High School in St. Paul . . .bats right and throws right. . .shared first base duties as a junior and ranks as leading candidate for that spot in 1971. . .hit .360 in 19 games last season . . .hits with power and had 10 RBI's as a junior. . .held down the tight end post on St. Cloud's football team last fall.
