The second Speech Day Festival for high school students will be held at the Teachers College on Saturday, Nov. 25. All college students will be welcome to attend the events. Special attention is called to the evening program, which will consist of a one-act play, the work of two verse speaking choirs, a declamation, an original oration, extempore speaking, poetry reading from memory, and reading from manuscript. The evening program will be held in the Auditorium from seven to eight-thirty. The morning program will begin at ten. A luncheon will be served at the Central Junior High School at twelve-thirty, at which Professor Harry G. Barnes, of the University of Iowa will speak. Afternoon sessions will be held from two to five-forty-five. This is not a speech contest. Work of students will not be rated, but will be analyzed and discussed by qualified judges. Besides Professor Barnes, of the University of Iowa Speech Department, there will be here such other speech critics as Professor F.M. Rarig, Chairman of the Department of Speech, University of Minnesota, Miss Anne Simley of Hamline University, President of the Minnesota Association of Teachers of Speech, and Miss Helen Burke of the College of St. Benedict. More than thirty Minnesota high schools will send over three hundred students here for the festival. A detailed program will be posted on the English Club bulletin board on Thursday or Friday. Take advantage of this opportunity of observing the most progressive type of speech activity and hearing the comments of eminently qualified critics.
