**ACCOUNTING:** The Department of Accounting offers programs in professional careers in public accounting, industry, not-for-profit organizations, governmental organizations and teaching. Courses offered emphasize the development of students' analytical capabilities and understanding of the usefulness and limitations of accounting information.

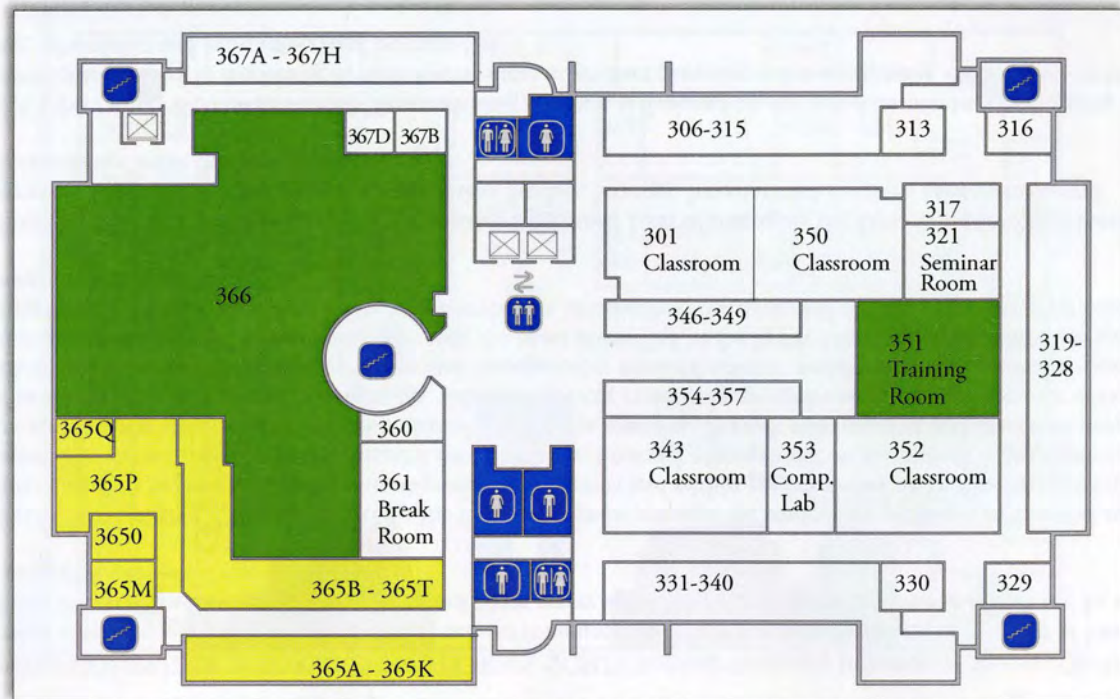
**BUSINESS COMPUTER INFORMATION SYSTEMS:** SCSU's Business Computer Information Systems (BCIS) program is the most extensive and comprehensive undergraduate computer information systems program in the state of Minnesota. It includes information assurance, data mining and client server applications in business, features that may not be available in other programs.

**FINANCE, INSURANCE, REAL ESTATE:** The finance program prepares the student for positions as financial managers and investment analysts in private business or non-profit organizations and within governmental units. Graduates are qualified for employment in the securities industry, financial intermediaries, financial management or investment organizations, international finance, and in government regulatory, administrative or service agencies. The risk management and insurance program offers specialization in areas such as risk management, risk management consulting, property and liability insurance sales, life and health insurance sales, insurance company operations and management, actuarial science, social insurance, insurance regulation, and insurance support services. The real estate program, the most diversified in the upper Midwest, offers numerous specializations including brokerage, sales, appraisal, financing, investments, contracting, planning and development, property management, and construction management.

**MANAGEMENT:** The management program encompasses broad areas of managing the firm. These include Human Resource Management, Operations Management, Organization Studies, Strategy, International Business Management and Entrepreneurship/Small Business Management.

**MARKETING AND BUSINESS LAW:** The marketing program is designed to develop skills and insights relating to strategies and activities for careers in marketing in such diverse areas as product planning and management, distribution, marketing research, retailing, advertising and promotion, and business law.

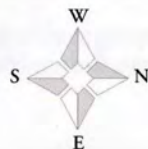

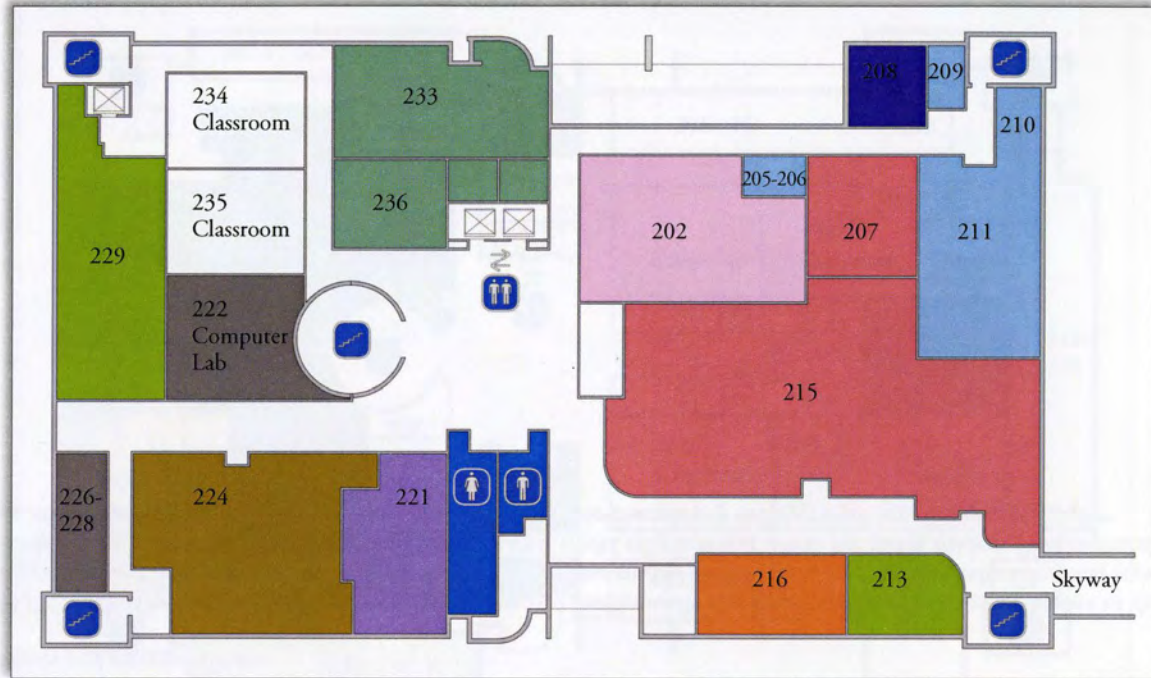


## FLOOR THREE

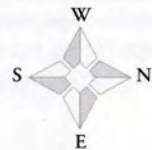

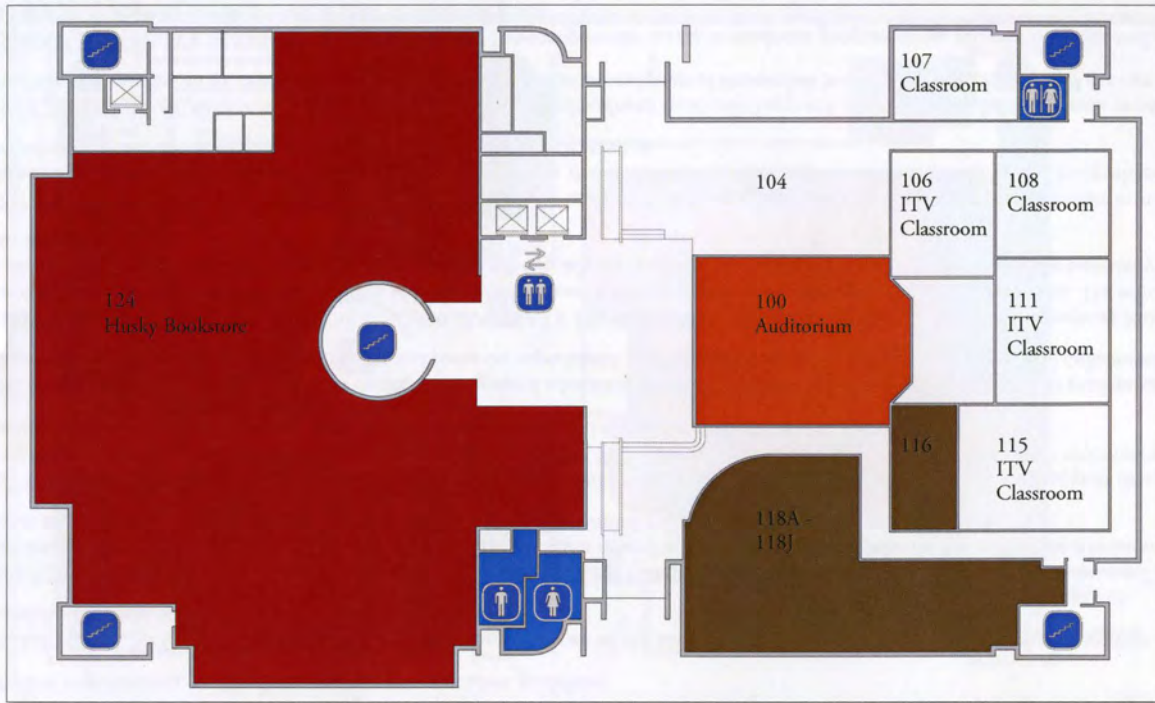

## FLOOR TWO

-  **ACADEMIC LEARNING CENTER:** The Academic Learning Center's (ALC) provides study and reading assistance to students enrolled at SCSU to help them become more efficient and effective learners.
-  **ADVISING CENTER:** The SCSU Advising Center provides academic resources to enable students to successfully progress through and balance graduation requirements, major classes and general education guidelines.
-  **CAREER SERVICES CENTER:** The Career Services Center is a state of the art, comprehensive resource center focusing on student career planning and decision-making, internships and employment services.
-  **COMMUNITY COLLEGE CONNECTION:** The Community College Connection, administered by Anoka Ramsey Community College, provides an excellent opportunity to begin the college experience. -  **FIRST YEAR EXPERIENCE:** The First Year Experience program offers a variety of Learning Communities designed to support first year students in making vital connections and a successful transition to university life. While participation in FYE is voluntary, it is highly recommended and offers incoming students an excellent way to get their feet on the ground and make the most of their first year at SCSU.
-  **HONORS:** Honors provides an alternative to the SCSU general education program. It is designed to appeal specifically to academically talented students. Courses feature unique subject matter and focus on experiential and integrated learning, discussion, writing, and collaborative projects.
-  **HERBERGER COLLEGE OF BUSINESS UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS/ASSESSMENT:** The Office of Undergraduate Programs/Pre-Business advising is designed to serve the needs of both undergraduate students and faculty teaching undergraduate courses. The office provides direction to students on choice of major/minor within the college, advises students on choice of classes and assists with the university's efforts to attract quality students.
-  **MATH SKILLS CENTER:** The Math Skills Center is to serve as a bridge for under-prepared students as they get ready to enter into college level mathematics courses. It is committed to providing an environment that will foster the learning of mathematics through a comprehensive and coordinated program of assessment, instruction, support and referral services.
-  **MULTICULTURAL ACADEMIC SUPPORT CENTER:** The Multicultural Academic Support Center provides direct academic services to students to build the skills needed to successfully complete college and serves as a focal point of interaction between students, faculty and the campus community.
-  **STUDENT DISABILITY SERVICES:** Student Disability Services provides access to academic programming, accommodations and advocacy for students with disabilities in the pursuit of their educational goals.
-  **UNDERGRADUATE STUDIES:** Undergraduate Studies facilitates the transition to college and support student success through a wide range of first year academic support services. Undergraduate Studies cooperates with student support and transition programs across campus in order to help students achieve their educational goals.
