Students who expect to receive their degrees or qualify for the twoyear diplomas this summer should call at the Placement Bureau as soon as possible and fill out enrollment blanks.

All former graduates of the St.Cloud State Teachers College enrolled in the summer session have their credentials on file in the Placement Bureau. Many of these credentials are, however, out of date. Graduates are therefore invited to call at the Placement Bureau and bring them up to date by the addition of letters concerning experience in recent years. There is no charge for this service aside from necessary postage.

Graduates of high school teacher training departments who wish to transfer their credits to the Teachers College must leave their credits properly signed by the County Superintendent with the registrar in the Business Office.

A student who finds it necessary to leave school before the close of the session should make arrangements with the Registrar for an honorable dismissal. If it is impossible to do this before leaving, the student should write to the Registrar as soon as possible explaining fully reasons for leaving.

Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course.

The Business Office will be open for students and faculty during the following hours: 8:30 a.m. - 12 o'clock and 1:00 p.m. - 3 p.m.

Students are required to leave their addresses and telephone numbers at the telephone in the Business Office if they were not located when they registered. This is important because we frequently find it necessary to locate students when not attending classes.

Students should inquire in the Textbook Library for lost books. Articles which have been lost may be claimed in the Business Office.

Students are requested to secure their post office box numbers and to call for their mail regularly. Please check your box number on the list posted in the Post Office and call for your mail at least ONCE EVERY DAY. If your name has not been spelled correctly, kindly report it to the Business Office. Two students have been assigned one box which means that each student must be careful to take mail or notices addressed only to him.

A fee of one dollar will be charged students who fail to take an examination as scheduled.

Students who expect to graduate at the close of the first summer session must make application for their diplomas in the Business Office with the Registrar not later than Saturday, June 20.

Students who are earning credits for the renewal of their certificates should see the Registrar not later than Saturday, June 20.
