Complete payment for board and room at the dormitories for the Summer Session must be made in the Business Office by Monday, June 16. A penalty of \$1.00 for late payment will be charged beginning on Tuesday, June 17.

Students are requested to secure their post office box numbers and to call for their mail regularly. Please check your box number on the list which has been posted and call for your mail at least ONCE EVERY DAY. If your name has not been spelled correctly, kindly report it to the Business Office. Two students have been assigned one box which means that each student must be careful to take only mail addressed to him. If you have not been assigned a box, kindly report to the Business Office.

Students who expect to graduate at the close of the first summer session must make application for their diplomas in the Business Office not later than Monday, June 16.

Students are required to leave their addresses and telephone numbers at the telephone in the Business Office because we frequently find it necessary to locate students when not attending classes.

The Textbook Library will be open every day from 2 P.M. to 4 P.M.

Students who are earning credits for the renewal of their certificates and whose certificates expire this year should report to the Registrar not later than June 23.

The Business Office will be open to Students and Faculty during the following hours: 8:30 A.M. - 12 Noon, 12:30 P.M. - 3 P.M., Saturday 8:30 A.M. - 12 Noon.

Students will not be permitted to change their programs after Saturday, June 14 and a fee of \$1.00 will be charged if a change is made. No credit will be given for courses which are not on the program cards in the Registrar's office.

Students should inquire in the Textbook Library for lost books. Articles which have been lost may be claimed in the Business Office.

A student who finds it necessary to leave school before the close of the session should make arrangements with the Registrar for an honorable dismissal. If it is impossible to do this before leaving the student should write to the Registrar as soon as possible explaining fully reasons for leaving.

Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course.
