Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. Students may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade but if he drops a course the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

A student program is a sixteen-hour program, exclusive of physical education or a one-hour course unless additional courses have been approved by the administration. No credit can be allowed for work which does not appear on the program card which must be on file in the Office of the Registrar.
