# St. Cloud State Teachers College

*formerly St. Cloud State Normal School*



AN act of the last Legislature provides that, hereafter, the Normal Schools of Minnesota shall be called Teachers Colleges. This act authorizes the Teachers Colleges to prescribe a four-year course and to grant an appropriate degree.

The St. Cloud State Teachers College was established in 1869. It is the largest institution of its kind in Minnesota and one of the largest in the Northwest. Thirty-nine hundred students have graduated from the institution, and the alumni hold some of the most important teaching and administrative positions in Minnesota and in other states. The total enrollment for the year 1920-1921 was 1,208.

High-school graduates are admitted to the advanced course without examination upon presentation of credentials, and they receive the advanced diploma after completing the two-years' course. This diploma legalizes the holder to teach in the grades in any city or town of the state and, after two years of successful experience, becomes a life certificate. A two-years' course will admit to junior standing in the College of Education of the University of Minnesota.

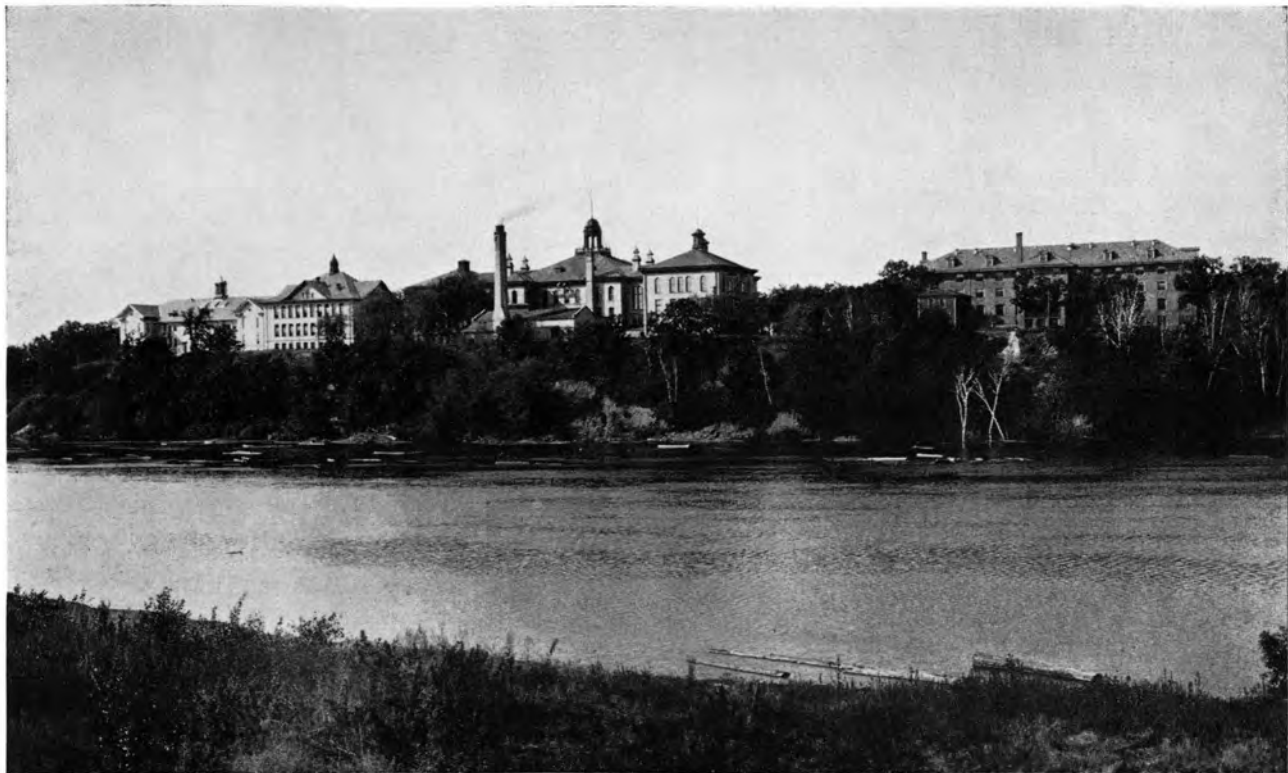
Courses are offered for those who wish to prepare to teach in kindergarten-primary, intermediate, or advanced grades. Courses leading to special diplomas are offered in home economics, industrial arts, and music. Although the college is the largest in the state, the demand for the graduates far exceeds the supply.

The college encourages athletics and social activities. The athletic teams of recent years have been among the best in the state. There are seven literary societies, a dramatic club, a rural-life club, and other students' organizations.

The campus is unusually attractive. There are two excellent dormitories for young women, and board and room are provided at a very low rate. There is no tuition for those who declare their intention to teach in Minnesota for two years.

The spirit of the college is one of wholesome optimism and good-fellowship. Those who wish to learn further details in regard to the college are asked to write for the catalog.

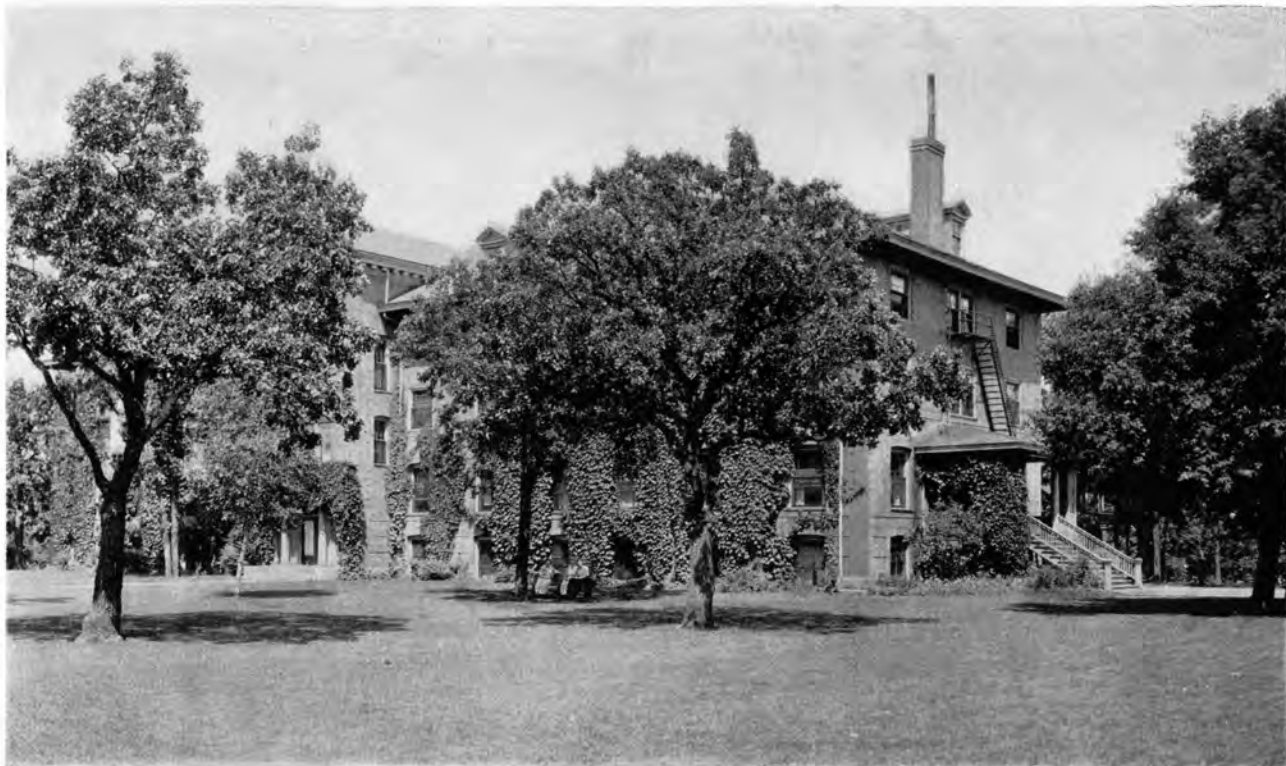

# What the College Offers

1. A high-school graduate is admitted without examinations and may prepare to teach in the rural schools in one year and the grade schools in two years.
2. A high-school graduate can complete both the regular course and the special course in music, domestic science, or industrial arts in three years.
3. There are special courses for those who wish to prepare to teach in the lower, intermediate, or upper grades, or in rural schools.
4. Special courses are offered in domestic science, industrial arts, and music.
5. Courses are offered which are given full credit at the University of Minnesota.
6. A course is offered for those who have not completed a course in a four-year high school.
7. No tuition is charged in case a student expects to teach in Minnesota.
8. Necessary expenses are unusually low. Board and room in the dormitories are now only five dollars and seventy-five cents a week.
9. There is an active association of loyal alumni.
10. Students are enrolled from almost every county in Minnesota and from several other states.
11. There are literary societies, a dramatic club, debating teams, a glee club, a rural-life club, and other student organizations.
12. The athletic teams are among the best in the state; and football, basketball, tennis, and swimming receive special attention.
13. There is a well selected library of more than sixteen thousand volumes.
14. Requests are received for teachers from every county in the state and from many other states, and the demand for the graduates far exceeds the supply.
15. There is an excellent school spirit.
16. There is an opportunity for you to secure an education in the largest Teachers College of the state at a very low cost.
