Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the adviser. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. A student may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade, but if he drops a course the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

Students will be permitted to repeat subjects totaling not to exceed 16 quarter hours on the two year or four year course.
