Slogan: THE HEALTH OF THE CHILD IS THE POWER OF THE NATION.

Objective: To bring to the attention of each community- (1) The importance to the Child's health, development and wellbeing throughout life, of FROPER FOOD, REST, EXERCISE, MEDIGAL CARE, and PRO-TECTION FROM DISEASE; (2) The ways of informing parents and others how child health may be safeguarded, and (3) the means whereby such safeguards may be made available for ALL children.
