Dr. Sverre Norborg is one of Norway's noted students of the younger generation. At the age of 12 he was a concert pianist. At the age of 23, he was made a candidate of theology at the Independent Theological University in Oslo, with the Highest honor that the University has bestowed. He continued his studies at the Universities of Berlin, Erlangen, Leipzig, Germany; in Oxford, England and Columbia University, New York City. He received his Ph.D. degree from the University in Oslo. He has also had practical experience in the ministry having served as pastor in the Cathedral Church in Bergen, Norway and as pastor of the great Seaman's Church in New York City.

Dr. Norborg is at present appointed to the chair of Philosophy at the University of Minnesota; teaches at Macalester College and at Augsburg Seminary and College.
