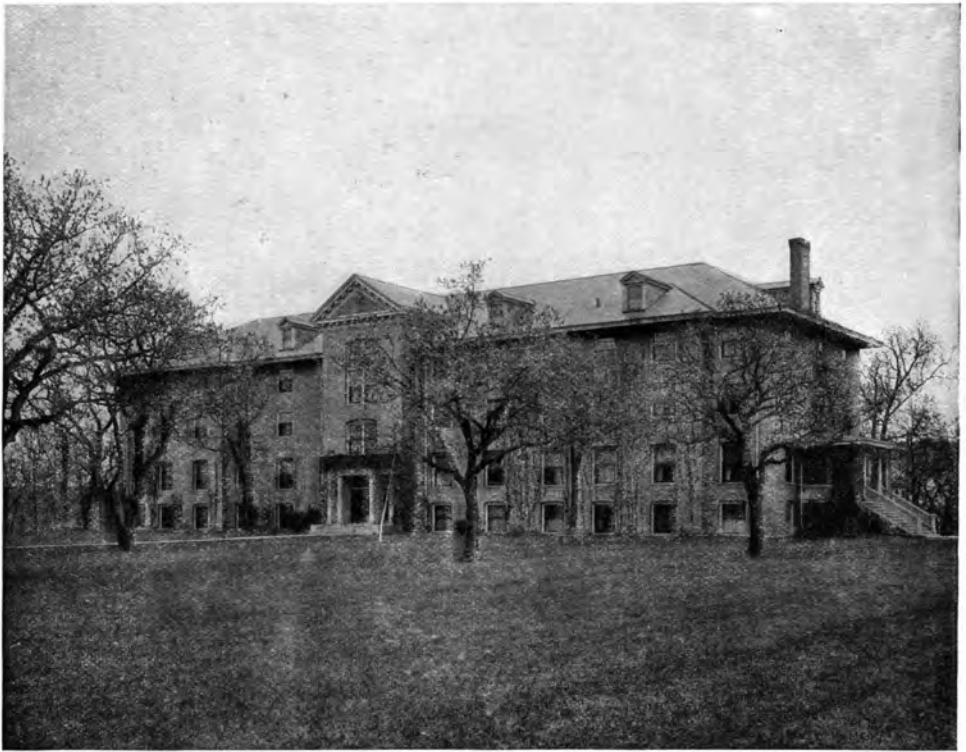

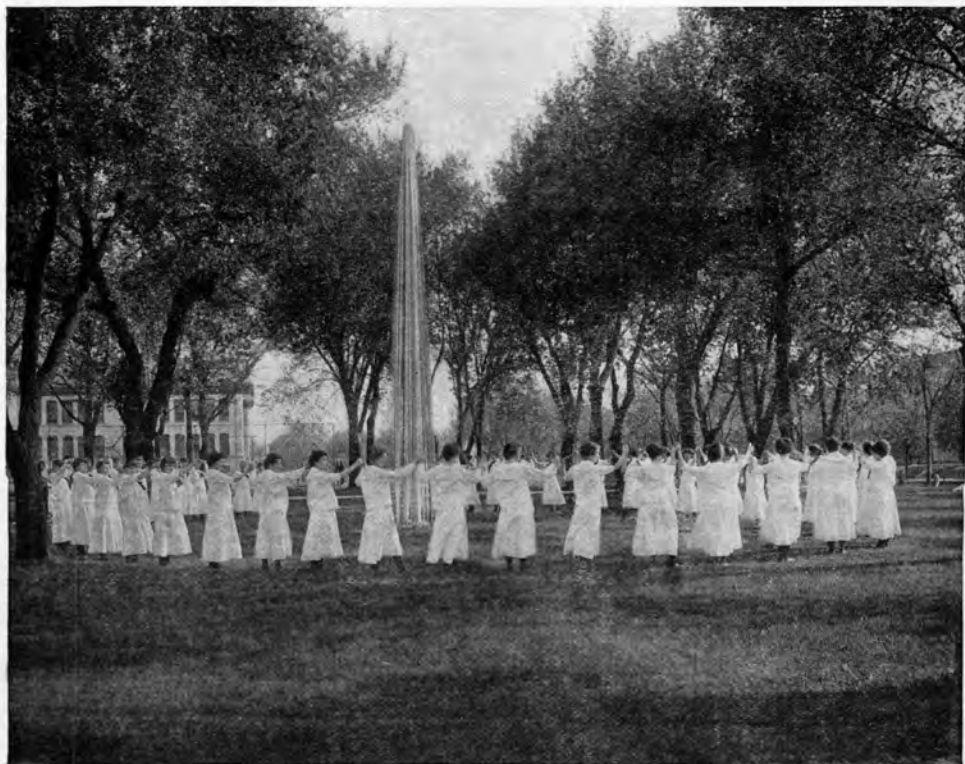

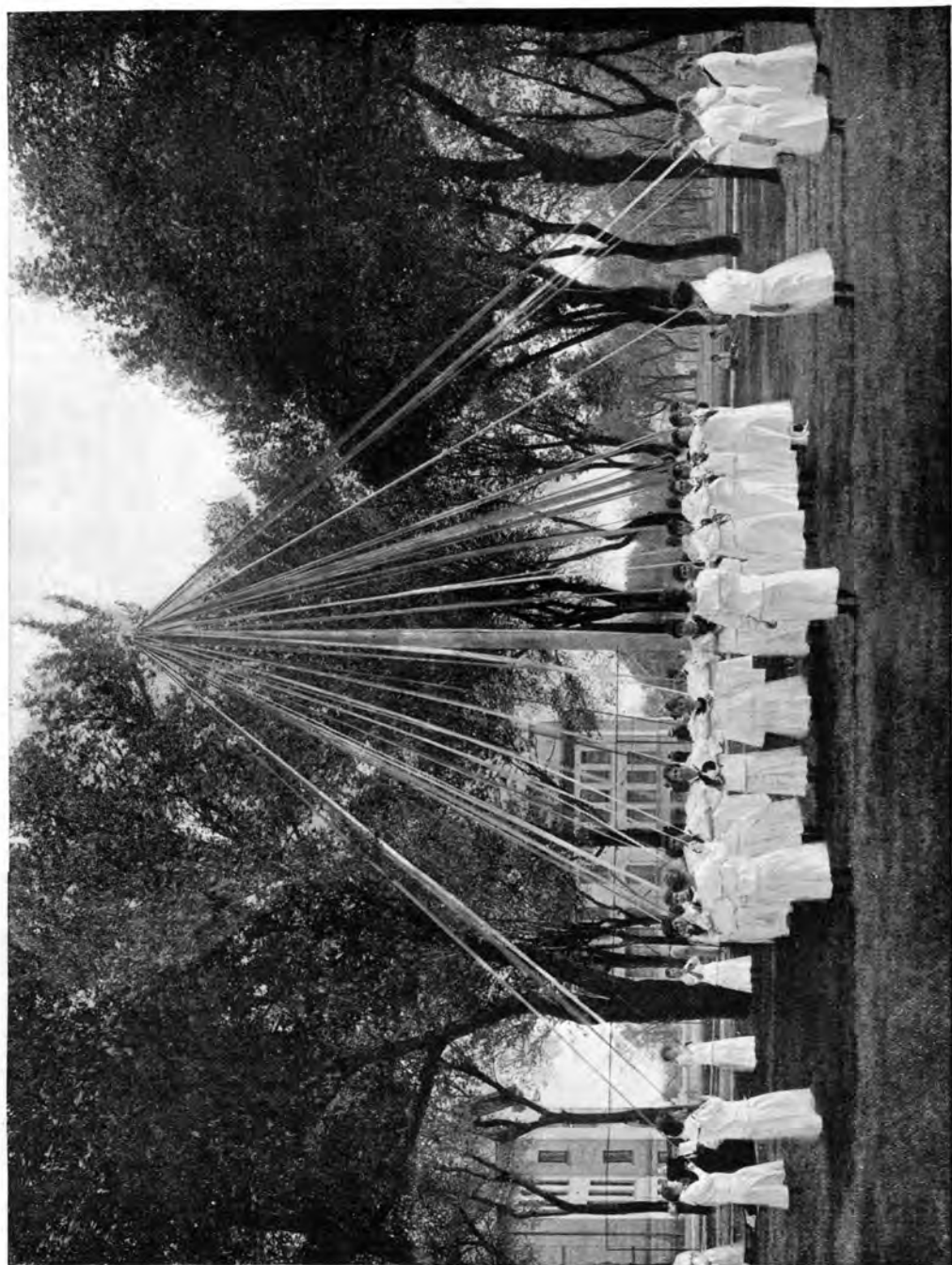

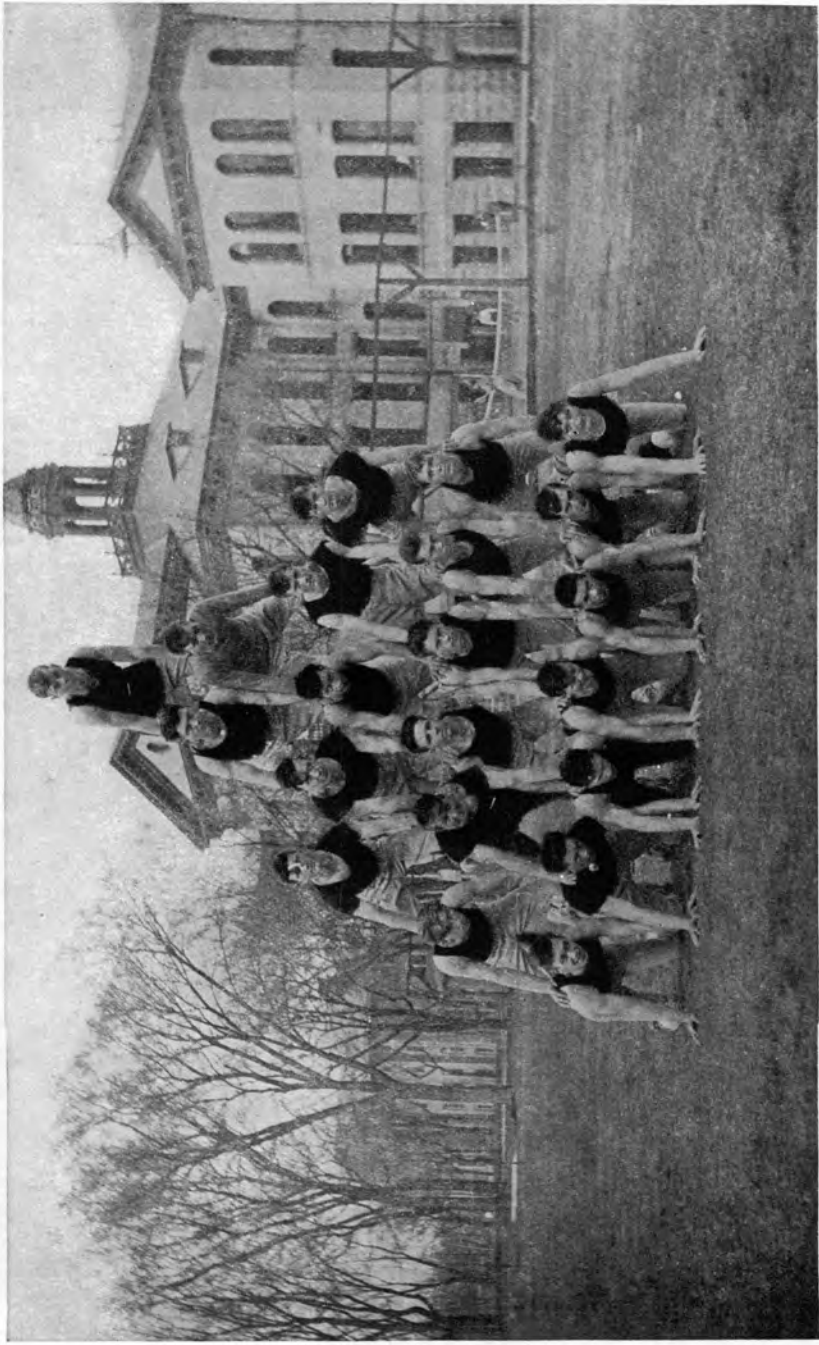

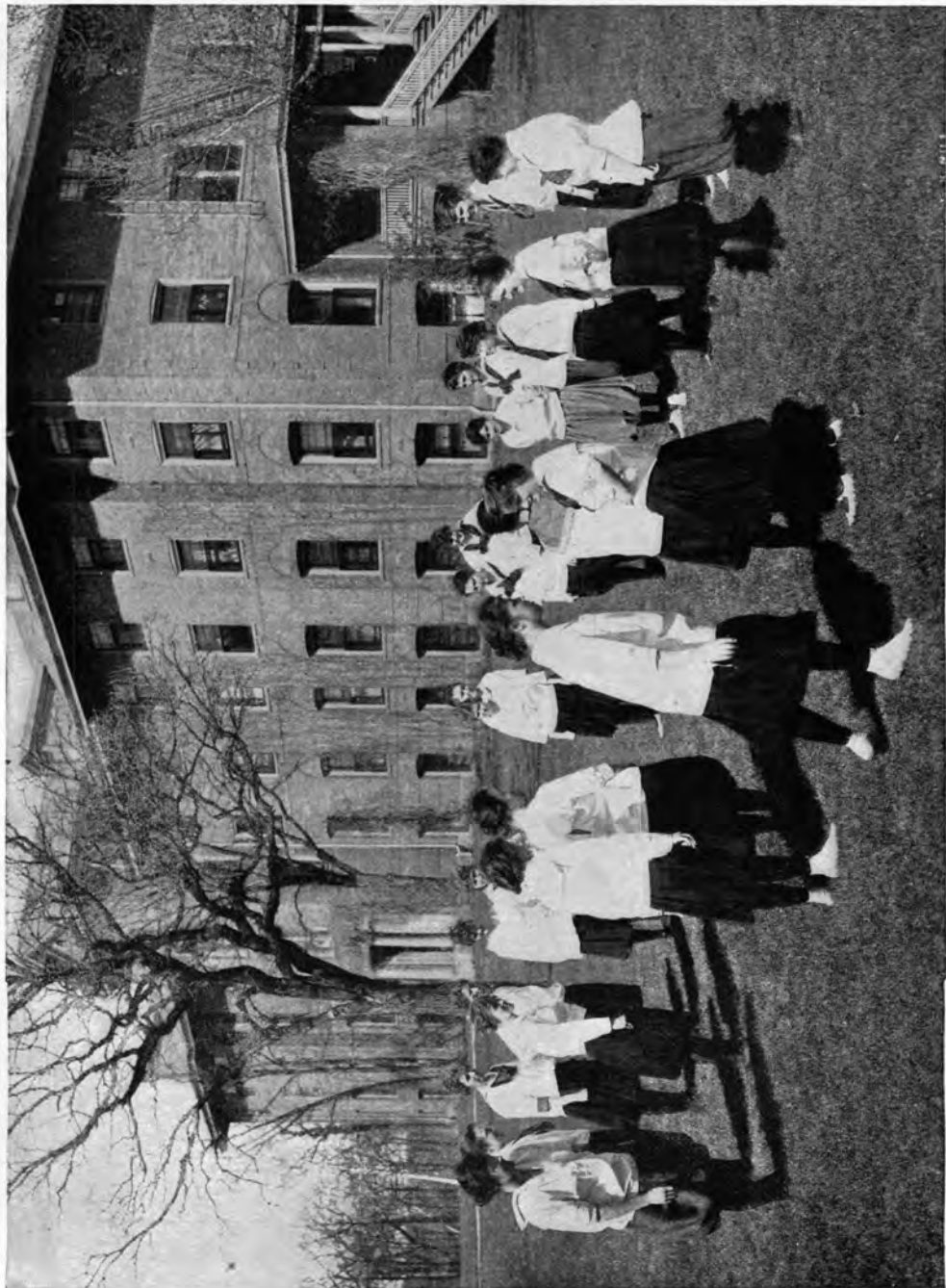

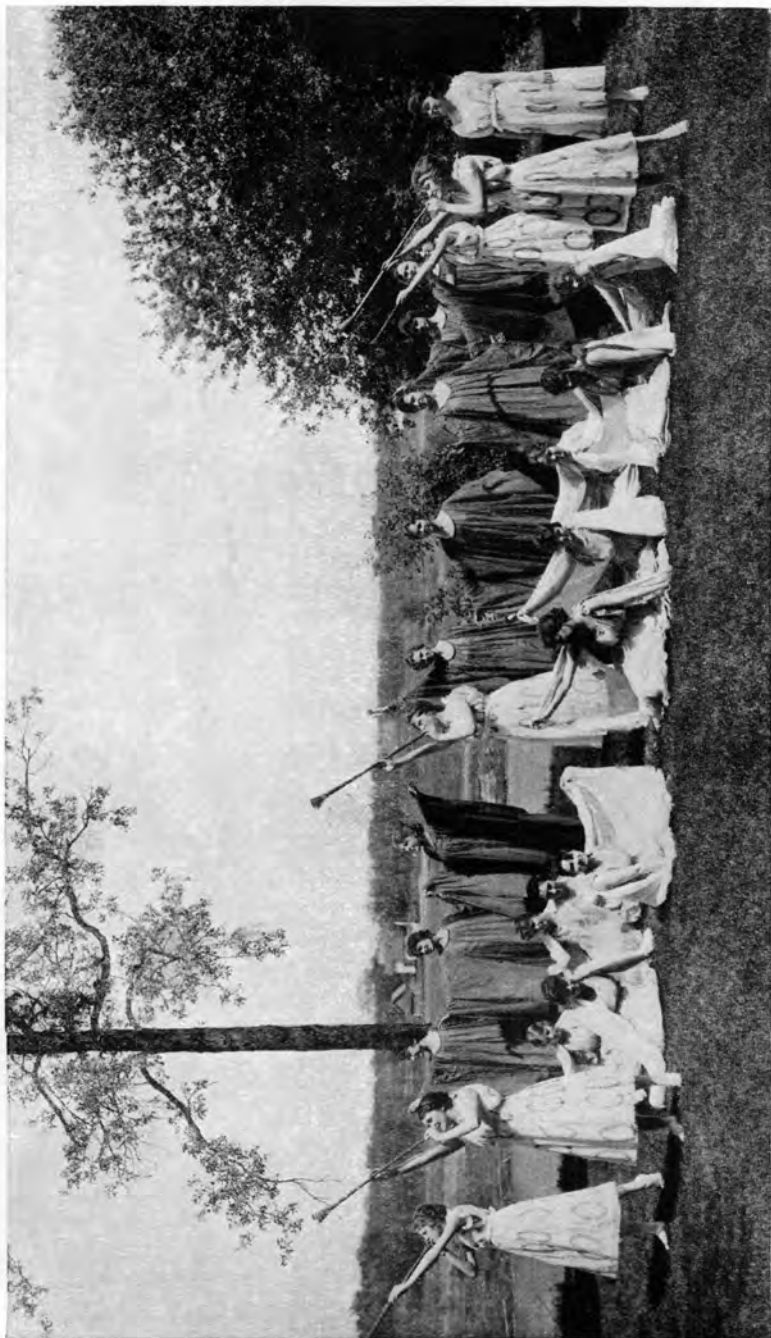

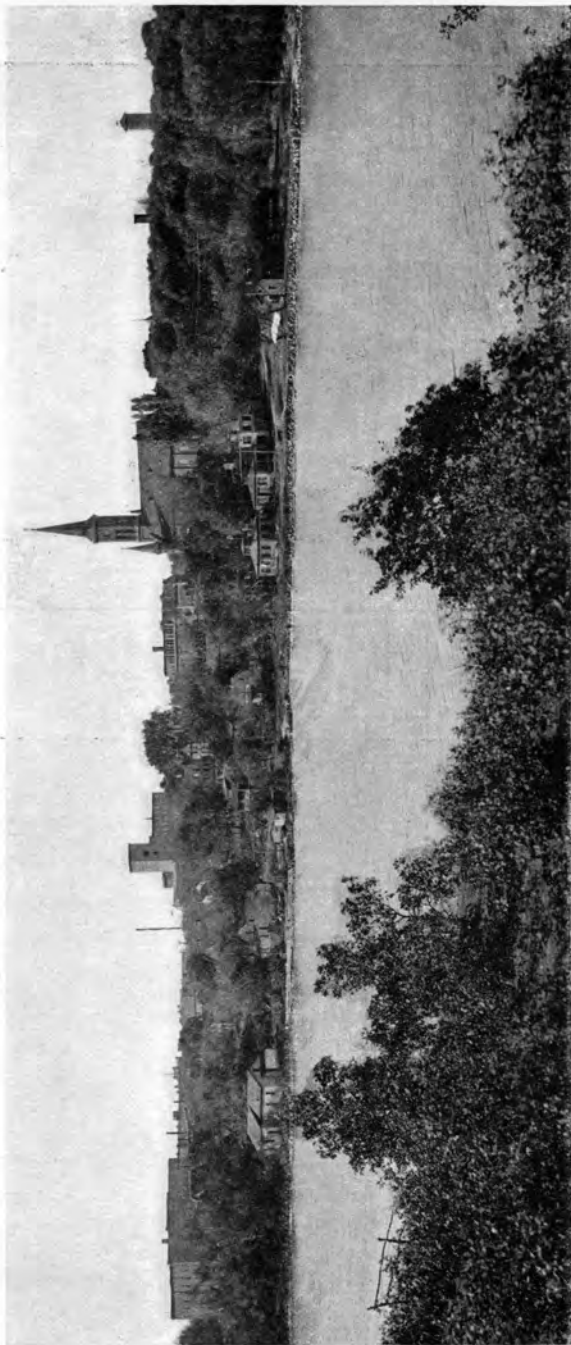

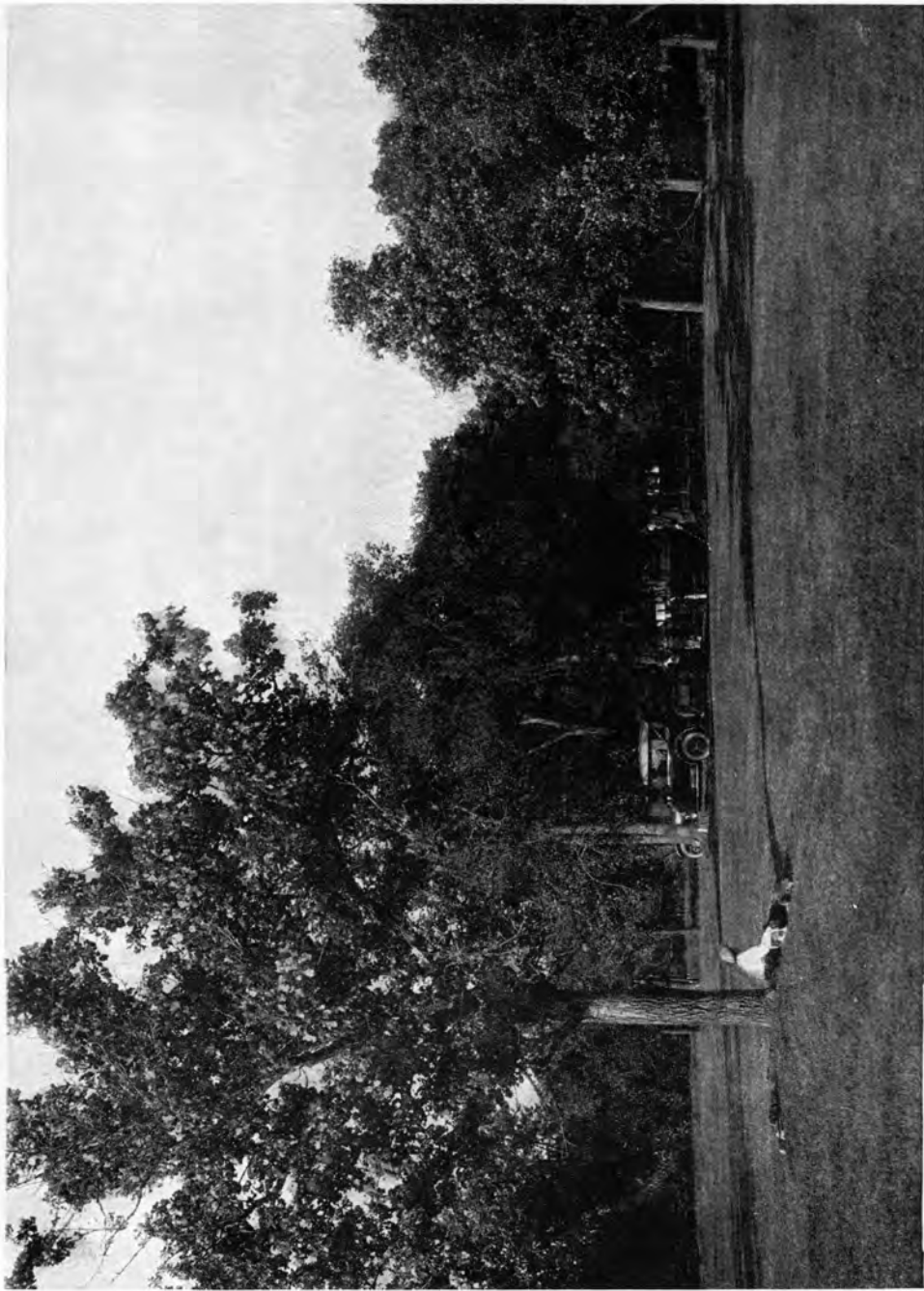

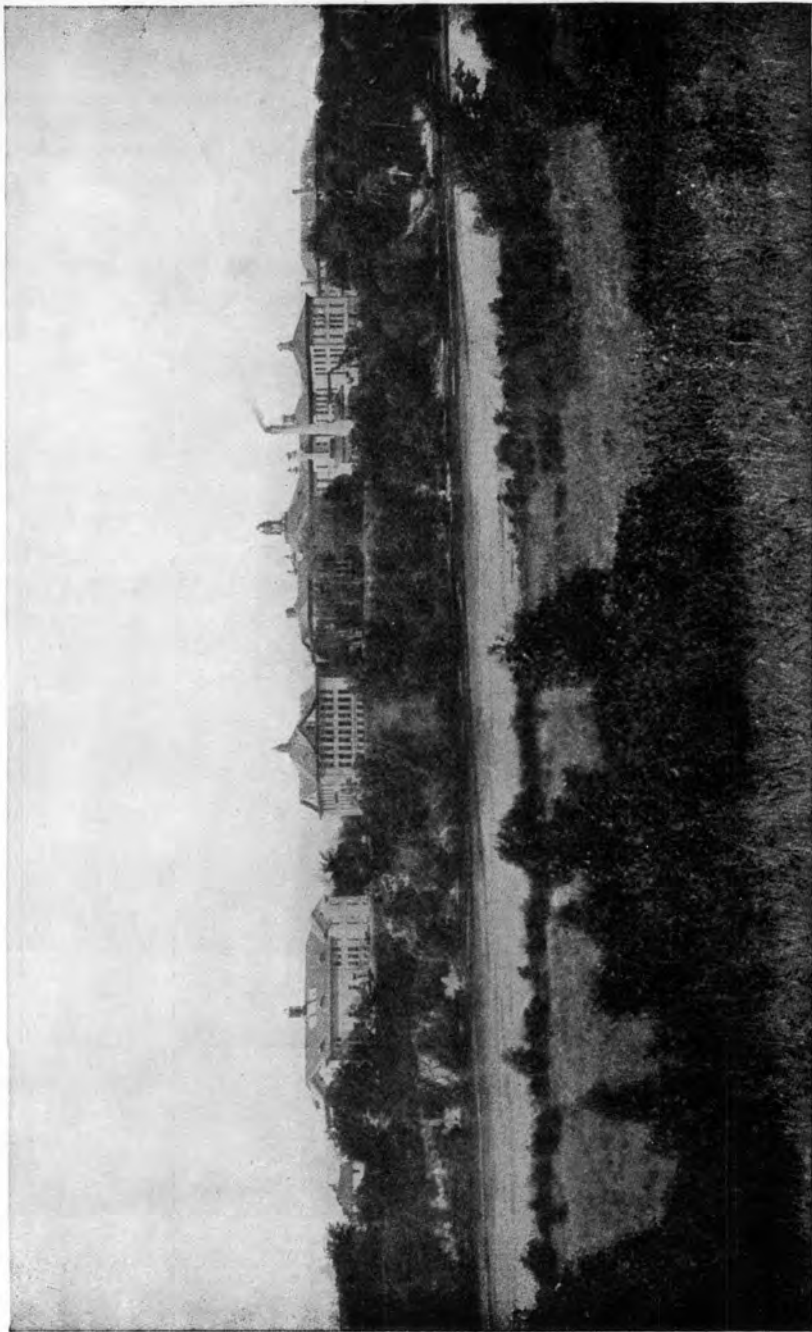

# The St. Cloud Normal School

## Establishment and Organization

The St. Cloud Normal School was established in 1869. It is maintained for the purpose of preparing teachers for the schools of the state.

Graduates of approved four year high schools are admitted to the two-year course without examinations upon presentation of their diplomas and certified copies of their high school records. Those who complete the two-year course are certified to teach in the grades of any school in the state without examination. Graduates of the two-year course are admitted as juniors to the University of Minnesota.

A special three-year course is offered to prepare students for teaching in the junior high schools, and to prepare school supervisors, normal training instructors, and principals. Special three-year courses are offered in home economics, manual training, and music. Graduates of these courses are prepared to supervise these special subjects in the schools.

A five-year course is offered for those who have completed only the eighth grade of the elementary schools. Students who have completed one or more years of high school work but are not high school graduates are admitted to the five-year course with advanced credits.

High school graduates who have taken the normal training course in high school as post-graduate work may receive eight credits on the two-year course.

## Board and Room

Located on the campus overlooking the Mississippi River are two excellent dormitories for young women. These dormitories are modern in every detail. In these dormitories the young women may enjoy the best influences, every effort being made to care for their health, comfort, and happiness. The charge for board and room is very low.

Students who prefer may secure board and room in desirable private homes in the city.

## Other Expenses

No tuition fee is charged. Text books are rented to the students for two dollars per term.

At no other school can one secure a higher education with so little expense as at a Normal School.



### **Demand for the Graduates**

The demand for the graduates of the St. Cloud Normal School far exceeds the supply, although the school is one of the largest of the Normal Schools in the northwest. All graduates who wish to teach are placed in desirable positions at good salaries. The school has more than thirty-five hundred active and loyal alumni.

### **Athletics and Other Sports**

Competent directors are in charge of the athletics and other recreational activities. Several of the teams have been among the best in the state. A lake provides skating, and excellent facilities are provided for tobogganing. Tennis courts are provided by the school. A special course in playground games is offered.

### **What the School Offers**

The St. Cloud Normal School offers you the opportunity to secure an excellent general education. It will prepare you to teach without examination in the grades and junior high schools of the state; it will enable you to enter the University of Minnesota with two years of advanced standing; it provides special courses in domestic art, manual training, and music; and it offers unusual opportunities in athletics. All of its graduates are guaranteed positions. The school will prepare you for a desirable position at a good salary.

Students may enter at the beginning of the fall, winter, spring, or summer terms.
