ATTENTION SOPHOMORES: All sophomores who will graduate from the two-year course during the present school year or the summer sessions and are now enrolling in the Placement Bureau must have their registration card checked by someone in the Placement Bureau before handing the card in. DO NOT LEAVE YOUR CARD IN THE BUREAU IF NO ONE IS THERE TO CHECK IT

A student who finds it necessary to leave school before the close of the session should make arrangements with the Deans for an honorable dismissal. If it is impossible to do this before leaving, the student should write to the Deans as soon as possible explaining fully reasons for leaving.

Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. A student may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade, but if he drops a course during the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

Students are required to leave their addresses and telephone numbers at the telephone in the Business Office if they were not located when they registered. This is important because we frequently find it necessary to locate students when not attending classes.

Students will be permitted to repeat subjects totaling not to exceed sixteen quarter hours on the two year or four year course.

Students who expect to graduate at the close of the winter quarter must make application for their diplomas in the Business Office with the Registrar not later than Monday, December 15.
