No changes can be made in programs after Friday, Mar. 15th. After that date a fee of one dollar will be charged to student who change their programs. No credit will be given for courses which are not on the program cards in the Registrar's Office

Before students will be assigned student teaching they must have a C average in all the prerequisite subjects. Those who have not earned the required honor points must repeat subjects in which they lack honor points. Students will be permitted to repeat only four subjects on either the two-year or four-year curriculum.

Subjects may be dropped only with the approval of the administration. Students who drop a course without permission will be dropped automatically from a second course and will receive a grade of "E" in each course. Students may drop a course during the first six weeks regardless of grade, but if he drops a course the last six weeks he will receive a grade of "E" if his work is failing at the time.

A student who finds it necessary to leave school before the close of the quarter should make arrangements with the Dean of Women or Dean of Men for an honorable dismissal. If it is impossible to do this before leaving, the student should write to the dean as soon as possible explaining fully reasons for leaving.

A student program is a sixteen-hour program, exclusive of physical education or a one-hour course. No change in program can be made without the approval of the administration. No credit can be allowed for work taken which does not appear on the program which must be on file in the office of the Registrar.

Students are requested to leave their addresses and telephone numbers at the telephone in the Business Office if they were not located when they registered.

The Post Office box assignments are posted in the Post Office. Please check your box number and call for your mail at least once a day.

Students should inquire in the Textbook Library for lost books. Articles which have been lost may be claimed in the Business Office.

Students who have not been invited to any of the student-faculty teas this year are requested to leave their names at the Student-Organization Office.

It is very important that the St. Cloud address of each college student should be corrected filed in the office of the Deans and in the Business Office.

Women students who have changed employment or have just taken new employment are asked to notify Dean Garvey. Cooperation in this matter will facilitate the issuance of library privileges and assist in the making of a study of employment among college women.

College Organizations- The Organizations Committee calls your attention to the following items:

1. Standards to be maintained by Officers and committee chairman.
 - a. Scholastic average of C or above.
 - b. Students may be presidents of only one organization.
2. Elections and appointments to the following positions must be completed by the date indicated.
 - Publications head - March 15
 - Council Executive officers - April 1
 - Class officers - April 15
 - Organizations officers - May 1
 - Council committee heads - May 15
3. Class Organizations
 - a. Sophomore, Junior, and Senior classes elect officers through a nominating committee consisting of the present officers and faculty advisers. This does not mean that a person who is a present officer cannot be nominated for a class officer the following year. Additional nominations may be made from the floor at the time of election.
 - b. Sophomore, Junior, and Senior class elections are to be held during the spring quarter, electing officers for the succeeding college year.
 - c. All slates for class officers must be posted one week before elections.
 - d. One person can hold only one office in a class.
